Sikh Student's Association Constitution

Lakehead University

Article 1: Name

The official name of the organization is the <u>Sikh Student's Association (SSA)</u> at Lakehead University.

Article 2: Purpose

The purpose of the Sikh Student's Association is to:

- 1. Promote awareness and understanding of Sikhism within the university and the broader community.
- 2. Provide a space for Sikh students to connect, share experiences, and support one another.
- 3. Organize cultural, religious, and educational events to celebrate Sikh heritage.
- 4. Encourage inclusivity and foster dialogue with students from all backgrounds.
- 5. Engage in community service and outreach initiatives.

Article 3: Membership

- 1. Eligibility: Membership is open to all students, faculty, staff of Lakehead University and to those who support the mission of the club.
- 2. Composition: At least 50% of the club's members must be current students of LUSU members. The remaining membership can include faculty, staff, alumni, and community members who align with the club's objectives.
- 3. Types of Membership:

General Members: Students who wish to participate in club activities.

Executive Members: Elected members who hold leadership roles.

4. Fees: No membership fees will be required.

Article 4: Executive Committee

The executive committee shall consist of the following positions:

- 1. President: Responsible for overall leadership, representing the club, and overseeing activities.
- 2. Secretary: Maintains records, meeting minutes, and communication with members.
- 4. Treasurer: Manages the club's funds and prepares financial reports.

Article 5: Elections and Terms

- 1. Elections will be held annually at the end of the academic year.
- 2. All members can vote, and any member in good standing can run for office.
- 3. Terms last for one academic year, with re-elections possible.

Article 6: Meetings

- 1. General Meetings: Held at least once per semester to discuss club activities.
- 2. Executive Meetings: Held monthly or as needed to plan events and manage affairs.
- 3. Quorum: At least 50% of executive members must be present for official decisions.

Article 7: Finances

- 1. The club shall maintain transparency in all financial matters.
- 2. Funds shall be used only for club activities, events, and administrative expenses.
- 3. The treasurer must present a financial report at the end of each semester.

Article 8: Amendments

1. Any member may propose an amendment to the constitution.

- 2. Amendments require approval from two-thirds of the voting members.
- 3. Changes must be submitted to the university's club administration.

Article 9: Dissolution

If the club dissolves, any remaining funds shall be donated to a Sikh charitable organization (Thunder Bay Sikh Society) or Lakehead University's student initiatives.

Article 10: Compliance with University Policies

The club shall adhere to all Lakehead University policies regarding student organizations.
